# CALL TO ORDER:

President Kosel called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and noted that all Directors were present.

### OATH OF OFFICE:

Director Nagel, as Board Secretary, administered the Oath of Office which was sworn to by Directors Harmon, Kassarjian and Kosel.

The Board members then said a sad farewell to outgoing Director Helmut Blaschczyk and presented him with flowers. Blaschczyk stated that he appreciated working with the other Board members and also appreciated that when there were differences in opinion everyone remained civil. Blaschczyk thanked staff and wished everyone his best.

President Kosel called for the approval of the consent calendar (items 4, 5, 6, 7 & 8) consisting of approval of the minutes of the October 8, 2014 meeting, approval of monthly transmittal #6, approval of the monthly October/November 2014 financial report, approval of the October monthly incident activity report, and November monthly incident activity report. ### CHIEF'S REPORT:

Chief Maples gave an overview of three grants that the department has recently been awarded, two from the California Homeland Security Program and one from the California Office of Traffic Safety. The first grant is for demolition and ventilation tools totally \$18,213, the second grant is for the purchase of a support vehicle that will be used to carry plywood/lumber for shoring and cribbing operations totally \$95,665 and the third grant is for auto extrication rescue equipment to be placed on the new ladder truck totally \$50,182. All three grants are fully funded (non matching). Maples gave credit to B/Cs Pigoni and Gibson for their work on submitting grants. Maples report listed the 17 grants the department has received in the last 10 years totaling \$2,346,828 in funds. Due to the current weather conditions, Maples cancelled the visit of the new ladder truck to the meeting.

Maples also reported that El Cerrito passed a half cent sales tax with a 12-year sunset during the November elections. This will help to continue El Cerrito's stable financial situation. The measure passed with over 70% approval. The school districts in the local area will be closed tomorrow due to weather projections. The El Cerrito Corporation Yard is stocked with sand bags for El Cerrito and Kensington residents.

### PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

The "K" Groups will be having their annual meeting on January 12th and Director Harmon will represent KFPD at that meeting. Kosel also noted that she brought some basketballs for the toy drive and invited everyone present to join her in supporting the annual El Cerrito-Richmond Firefighters holiday toy drive for underprivileged children in west county.





# **BACKGROUND**

The Fire District adopted a mutual response agreement in May of 1997 that authorized the Fire Chief to execute said agreement that provided for the exchange of fire services in the designated mutual response area during critical fire weather with the City of Berkeley.

# ANALYSIS/DISCUSSION

The Fire Chiefs of the Kensington Fire Protection District and the City of Berkeley desire to enter into an agreement to provide automatic aid for fire and station coverage to each jurisdiction on a year-round basis instead of a limited basis during critical fire weather.

This updated agreement will provide year-round response and improve response times of the fire alarm fire companies on the Kensington-Berkeley border and provide for automatic coverage of fire stations during greater alarm fires.

The Kensington Fire Protection District and Berkeley Fire Departments are members of the East Bay Regional Emergency Communications System Authority (EBRCSA) and have the capability to communicate on each agency's dispatch, command, or tactical radio channels. The ability to communicate on each agency's radio channels improves the coordination and response efforts on emergency calls. It should also be noted that this agreement will require an annual joint training exercise to insure common operations for both agencies are know by staff.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

EXCHANGE OF FIRE PROTECTION AND EMERGENCY SERVICES
BETWEEN THE CITY OF BERKELEY AND THE KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION
DISTRICT

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into on , 2015, by and between the City of BERKELEY on the one hand and the KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT on the other hand. BERKELEY and KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT shall be referred to as "Party" or "Parties".

This MOU is made with reference to the following facts and objectives:

The City of BERKELEY and KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT each maintain and operate fire protection organizations in and for their respective jurisdictions; and

Certain of the lands protected by each Party herein are adjacent to the lands protected by the other Party; and

The Cities of BERKELEY and KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT each desire to furnish fire and emergency assistance to the other when such aid is required as set forth below; and

This MOU is executed pursuant to the provisions of the California Emergency Services Act, Title 2, Division 1, Chapter 7 of the Government Code, Government Code sections 8615-8619, Government Code section 53000 et seq., Government Code Section 55630 et seq., Health & Safety Code 13050 et seq., Health & Safety Code section 13800 et seq. and Public Resources Code section 5561.6.

The Parties mutually agree as follows:

- The Fire Chief of the Berkeley Fire Department and the Fire Chief of the KENSINGTON Fire Protection District are hereby authorized to develop, execute and implement this MOU, which shall set forth the specific procedures and protocol to be used to effect a mutual and coordinated response to reports of fire in established automatic aid areas.
- Berkeley Fire Department shall communicate on KENSINGTON Fire
  Protection District's designated command and tactical channel when
  responding into KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT.
  KENSINGTON Fire Protection District shall communicate on Berkeley Fire
  Department's designated command and tactical channel when responding
  into BERKELEY.

- 3. Joint training exercises shall be carried out annually or as needed under the direction of the Fire Chiefs of the City of Berkeley and KENSINGTON Fire Protection District.
- 4. The Berkeley Fire Department and KENSINGTON Fire Protection District shall use the Incident Command System (ICS), the standard organization system, to govern emergency operations.
- The jurisdictional department having authority shall be responsible for obtaining information and completing required reports. All reports which include automatic or mutual aid under this MOU shall be shared between the Parties.
- The Parties shall furnish fire protection, apparatus, personnel, equipment, materials, or supplies and render such fire protection services or station coverage to each other in the manner described in this MOU.
  - a. KENSINGTON Fire Protection District may respond with an engine company for station coverage at Berkeley Fire Station 4, 1900 Marin Avenue, for BERKELEY upon request by the Berkeley Fire Department. KENSINGTON Fire Protection District may respond to emergency calls in BERKELEY while performing station coverage duties.
  - b. The KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT may respond with one Engine Company as part of an initial first alarm assignment to Berkeley Fire Quadrants 79, 80, 81, 82, and 83.
  - c. The KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT may respond with up to two engines (any combination of a Type I, III, or XI engine) and a Battalion Chief for a vegetation fire within Berkeley Fire Quadrants 76, 79, 80, 81, 82, and 83.
  - d. The BERKELEY Fire Department may respond with one Engine Company for station coverage at KENSINGTON Fire Station 65, 217 Arlington Avenue, for KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT upon request by the District. The Berkeley Fire Department may respond to emergency calls in the KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT response area while performing station coverage duties.
  - e. The Berkeley Fire Department may respond with up to two engines (any combination of a Type I, III, or XI) and a Battalion Chief for a vegetation fire within the KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT Fire Quadrant 65A or 65B which includes a geographical area previously referred to as the San Pablo Ridge MRA.

- f. Each Party shall ensure responding personnel don full personal protective equipment when responding to a vegetation or structure fire call in each party's jurisdiction.
- 7. In the event that the aiding Party is unable to dispatch, in whole or in part, an agreed-upon response as described above, the aiding Party shall immediately notify the requesting Party of the inability to respond or provide station coverage.
- 8. The services provided pursuant to this MOU shall not be used by either Party as a substitute for day-to-day full and continuing fire protection within its own borders. The rendering of aid by one party to the other hereunder is voluntary. Neither Party shall be required to reduce its own fire protection resources, personnel, services or facilities to the detriment of its normal fire protection capability within its borders.
- Neither Party to this agreement shall be required to provide compensation to the other for services rendered hereunder. The advantage and protection of mutual aid responses afforded by this agreement shall constitute the sole and adequate consideration for the performance hereof.
- 10. The City of BERKELEY shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT from and against all claims, expenses, losses, liability or damages resulting from the acts or omissions to act by the City of BERKELEY in the performance of this MOU. KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City of BERKELEY from and against all claims, expenses, losses, liability or damages resulting from the acts or omissions to act by KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT in the performance of this MOU.
- 11. Notwithstanding anything else stated to the contrary in this MOU, each Party shall be solely responsible for the actions of its respective officers, agents, and employees while they are performing work, services or functions for said Party under this MOU. While performing work, services, or functions under this MOU, the officers, agents and employees of each Party are not officers, agents, or employees of the other Party, regardless of the nature and extent of the acts performed by them. In this regard, Section 10 above shall in no way obligate the indemnifying Party to provide such protection, defense or indemnification to the extent of the acts or omissions of the other Party, its officers, agents or employees.
- 12. Each Party shall be solely liable to provide Workers' Compensation insurance coverage and pay valid claims for injuries or death to any of its officers, agents, or employees performing work, services or functions under this MOU, regardless of whether the other Party was directly or indirectly supervising the conduct of such person(s). To this end, no Party shall assume any liability

under Workers' Compensation laws or any other employers' liability laws on account of any work, service or function performed by the other Party's officers, agents or employees under this MOU.

- 13. In the event of any conflict between this MOU and any other mutual aid agreement between either party hereto and any county, state or federal government entity or division thereof, said other agreement shall take precedence.
- 14. This agreement may be amended at any time by a written amendment hereto executed by both parties. Any reduction, contracting or subcontracting of day-to-day full and continuing fire protection services or resources by either Party shall be cause for renegotiation of this agreement.
- 15. This MOU executed hereunder may be terminated on action by either the BERKELEY City Manager or KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT Fire Chief upon thirty days' written notice to the other.
- 16. This MOU shall supersede any and all prior agreements, oral or written, regarding the subject matter between the City of Berkeley and KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the City of BERKELEY and the KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT have executed this Memorandum of Understanding as of the date first written above.

# **RECOMMENDATION**

Adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a memorandum of understanding with the Kensington Fire Protection District to provide year-round automatic aid in each city's jurisdiction for fire and emergency medical calls, rescinding Resolution Nos. 56,813-N.S. and 59,159-N.S. and maintaining the existing mutual response area agreement until the year-round fire and emergency services agreement is codified.

# FISCAL IMPACTS OF RECOMMENDATION None.

# CURRENT SITUATION AND ITS EFFECTS

The Fire Chiefs from the Kensington Fire Protection District and the City of Berkeley desire to enter into an agreement to provide automatic aid for fire and station coverage to each jurisdiction on a year-round basis instead of a limited basis during critical fire weather.

This updated agreement will provide year-round response and improve response times of the first alarm fire companies on the Kensington-Berkeley border and provide for automatic coverage of fire stations during greater alarm fires.

The Kensington Fire Protection District and Berkeley Fire Departments are members of the East Bay Regional Emergency Communications System Authority (EBRCSA) and have the capability to communicate on each agency's dispatch, command, or tactical radio channels. The ability to communicate on each agency's radio channels improves the coordination and response efforts on emergency calls.

The Berkeley Fire Fighters Association Local 1227 were provided an opportunity to meet and confer with the City of Berkeley on the impacts of creating an automatic aid agreement, but declined to meet as Local 1227 concurs with the pursuit of such agreement.

# **BACKGROUND**

The City Council adopted Resolution No. 56,813-N.S. on January 12, 1993, that authorized the City Manager to negotiate and execute a mutual response agreement that provided for the exchange of fire services in the designated mutual response area during critical fire weather.

On September 17, 1997, the City Council adopted Resolution 59-159 N.S. authorizing the City Manager to negotiate and execute a mutual response agreement that provided for the exchange of fire services in the San Pablo Ridge area during critical fire weather.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING: THE KENSINGTON FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT FOR AUTOMATIC AID RESPONSE AND EXCHANGE OF FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES; AND RESCINDING RESOLUTION NOS. 56,813–N.S. AND 59,159–N.S.

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 56,813-N.S. was adopted by the City Council on January 12, 1993 authorizing the City Manager to negotiate and execute a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the exchange of fire protection with the Kensington Fire Protection District, and which would permit both Berkeley and Kensington Fire Departments to automatically respond to fires in pre-designated areas regardless of jurisdictional boundaries; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 59,159-N.S. was adopted by the City Council on September 17, 1997, establishing a MOU with the Kensington Fire Protection District establishing a mutual response area in the San Pablo Ridge area; and

WHEREAS, a MOU was executed on January 12, 1993, that authorized the Fire Chiefs of Berkeley and Kensington Fire Protection District to develop a Mutual Response Area Agreement that established specific procedures and protocols governing the response of each agency's fire department into the designated Mutual Response Areas during critical fire weather; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Chiefs of Berkeley and Kensington Fire Departments desire to update and modify the previous MOU to establish protocols and automatic-aid response to each other's jurisdiction to include structure fire response, station coverage, and response to fire or other emergency calls; and

WHEREAS, the Berkeley Fire Fighters Association Local 1227 concurs with the proposed agreement and declined to meet and confer to discuss the impacts of entering into a year round automatic-aid response agreement with the Kensington Fire Protection District to include fire and emergency medical responses.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Berkeley that Resolution Nos. 56,813 and 59,159 are hereby rescinded.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager is hereby authorized to maintain the existing MRA agreement until a successor agreement is ratified.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager negotiate and execute an updated Memorandum of Understanding with the Kensington Fire Protection District for the exchange of fire and emergency response procedures on a year round basis and made a part hereof a record signature copy of said MOU to be on file in the Office of the City Clerk.
