The Kensington Fire Protection District continues to offer on-going training opportunities to prepare yourself, your family and our community for a major disaster through the Community Emergency Response Team Training (CERT) program.

Training opportunities include the certified eight-week evening course plus all-day Saturday drill,



offered three times a year, or the non-certified one day "boot camp" offered twice a year.

Fall Shredding Event

The Kensington Fire Protection District will be holding its popular bi-annual shredding event on Saturday, October 27, 2018 from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.

This *free* event for Kensington residents takes place in the library/community center parking lot directly across from Arlington Community Church (52 Arlington Ave).

This service is offered to assist residents in clearing out excess combustible materials from their

homes. All shredded papers will be recycled and go to paper mills.

It is not necessary to remove staples or paperclips from your documents;



however it is helpful to remove items like large binder clips. Please remove papers from binders or from plastic binding. There is no limit to quantity of paper from Kensington residents' homes.


Best Wishes Chief Maples
